

BRITISH VIRGIN ISLANDS CHECKLIST

This checklist was designed to answer most, if not all, of your questions regarding our Dive Trips to the beautiful British Virgin Islands (BVI).

IMPORTANT: ALL FEES MUST BE PAID NO LATER THAN 6 WEEKS BEFORE THE DATE YOU ARE GOING!!!

Please call the shop at 316-684-9738 to confirm that you are going with us.

Your trip fee includes lodging on our beautiful Scubacat sailboat, tanks and weights, all meals on the boat, 4 - 5 dives daily (weather and time permitting) and **FUN!!!** Rental gear is available at the shop for those who need it.

NOTE: Come in to be fitted for your rental gear the week before you are scheduled for the BVI Trip. (You can turn in your signed liability forms at the same time, and either drop off a picture or pose for one!!). We are open until 8:00 PM Thursdays for your convenience. It is your responsibility to make sure that you have all your own gear, both for the trip to BVI and the trip home.

Things to Bring:

Here is a partial list for you to use as a starting point when planning and packing.

Signed liability forms (must be turned in to the dive shop prior to leaving on the trip)

Passport or Birth Certificate and valid Drivers license and/or other picture ID.

Certification Card (You don't have one, you don't dive, unless you are in training.)

Logbook

Swim Suit (You would be surprised how many people forget them. You may want to bring more than one since this and a t-shirt will be our primary dress code on the boat.)

Bath towel and Beach Towel

Leisure Clothes (for going a shore)

Wet Suit (a full length 3 mm for thermal and abrasive protection is recommended.)

Camera, Film and Extra Batteries (Film and Batteries are very expensive there)

Dive Lights for night dives. (Primary and backup. Don't forget to put new batteries in before you pack it. Bring extras.)

Dive Gear (You should already have a check list for all this stuff.)

Dry Bag to keep your dry stuff dry on the boat

Light Jacket or sweats for cool evenings.

Sun Glasses and Sun Screen

Any necessary medications and personal toiletries

Extra Batteries (for both flashlights and cameras or other electronic devices you may bring. Batteries are available but expensive.)
